



Borough of Florham Park Borough Council Meeting Minutes May 17, 2018

Council President Cefolo-Pane called the Regular Meeting of the Borough Council to order at 7:10 p.m. He asked the Clerk if the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act had been met. Deputy Borough Clerk Sheila Williams stated that adequate notice of the meeting had been made. It was included in the Annual Notice of Meetings published in the Florham Park Eagle. Council President Cefolo-Pane led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council President Cefolo-Pane stated that the meeting would begin with Council portfolio updates.

Council Portfolio updates were presented as follows:

Council President Cefolo-Pane provided the following report:

Planning & Zoning:

- A Planning Board meeting was held on Monday. A subdivision was approved for Brooklake Road and Burnside Road. There were also a few approvals of Change in Tenancy applications.
- A meeting has been published by Marlene Rawson regarding a joint meeting of the Planning Board and Borough Council on June 13th to talk about the old Asco property. The meeting begins at 6 p.m.

Senior Citizens:

- Senior Club and AARP held their regular meetings. One issue arose at the Senior meeting. The issue was Property Taxes as charitable contributions. I told them they had to talk to their tax professionals.
- Seniors would like to deviate from the policy in place on luncheons. They are planning on having their luncheon in June at the Hanover Manor.

Gazebo Concerts:

- Gazebo Concerts are set; Sheila has posted the schedule. We have Certificates of Insurance for our food vendors. We are waiting for two contracts from Performers which must be kept on file at the Borough.

Councilman Germershausen presented the following report:

Morris County Freeholders:

- Attended the Freeholder Gold Star Ceremony in Morris County. Two mothers attended and talked about their experiences as Gold Star parents and the ultimate sacrifice that was given by their children. It was very nice. Ann Grossi hosted the meeting which was attended by approximately 75 people.

- Historical Preservation Commission held a meeting last night on 5/16; The County Grant Board did a site survey at the cemetery. There are 8 stones that will need attention at Hancock Cemetery.
- Discussed site surveys for historic homes; want to ask homeowners to apply to the Commission if they want to be included in the list. There will be an application and the house can be inspected.
- The June meeting will be cancelled.

Councilman Carpenter presented the following report:

Police Department

- Due to the storm there were multiple vehicle accidents, road closures and downed trees.
- The Junior Police Academy is in its final stages of preparation; plan to work with the Fire Department and First Aid Squad to showcase all aspects of emergency services
- DARE graduation is June 8; NY JETS offensive lineman and Borough resident Bill Winters will be the guest speaker
- Fire Department held the first of a series of confined spaces drills with the Madison Fire Department
- No new firefighters in the pipeline; two firefighters passed Level 1 training

First Aid Squad:

- First Aid Squad will be having a blood drive on 6/4
- Squad would like to have a wet down for their new rig on Borough Property; currently looking into that and will report back.

Engineering:

- Curb contractor mobilizing for work on Leslie, Orchard, Tucker, Pine Valley, Country Club Lane
- Tilcon did some paving on Cathedral then suspended due to weather; they also have to do some work on Northern and Deerfield and Lockwood Road when weather permits.
- Advertised bids for E. Madison Phase II will go out next week

Department of Public Works:

- DPW busy with fields
- Department converted a used truck and got salter and lights on it; also working on attaching the plows

Councilman Malone presented the following report:

Finance:

- Patrice Visco has recently done a lot of work to supply Moody's Investors with financial information. As part of their annual review Moody's has recently reaffirmed Florham Park's Triple AAA Bond Rating; the highest possible rating. Florham Park is only one of a handful of municipalities in NJ to receive this rating. A press release was released to this effect. Sheila has extra copies if needed. The report is very favorable; a glowing report and it is encouraged that everyone read it. Mr. Malone thanked Patrice Visco and the rest of the Borough team for their hard work.

Recreation:

- The new trail is set for ribbon cutting on June 2nd at 10:00 a.m. The Freeholders will be attending. Florham Park received the first grant associated with the program
- Recreation Committee meeting to be held on 5/9; some topics to be discussed:
- Special events to held at the Municipal Pool
- Master Plan being reviewed by Committee
- Baseball backstop damage
- Subcommittee to discuss the Fred Stobaeus and Lou Boyd awards. We moved the awards to the 4th of July Parade; have some other ideas such as the possibility of the Mayor presenting this award at graduation instead to award the winners in front of their peers. The winners could then ride in the 4th of July Parade, rather than selecting and notifying prior to July 4th. That was just one idea we had. We would like to keep this award elevated as it is an important award in Florham Park.
- Waiting on installation of AED machines for some locations; one was already installed at Stobaeus Field.
- Basketball/Tennis Court rehabilitation estimate was \$300,000
- Also discussed shelters and Emmett Field and Volunteer's Park; working on looking at 2-3 shelters to install.

- There is an opening on the Recreation Committee; secretary has stepped down. If anyone is interested, please let Councilman Malone know.

Councilman Zuckerman provided the following report:

Environmental Commission:

- Working on a date for the ribbon cutting for the bridge at Spring Garden Lake

Municipal Pool:

- The pool is being power washed as we speak; when that is done we will start filling it to be on point for opening Memorial Day Weekend

- Water Utility has a chemical testing company coming at the end of the month for annual service and recalibration of sampling instruments.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Council President Cefolo-Pane opened the meeting to the Public at 7:45 p.m.

John Winters, 32 Brooklake Road

Mr. Winters asked about Ordinance 18-14, Accessory Apartments. Is that Bergen County United Way?

Council President Cefolo-Pane said that is not the Affordable Housing. United Way has not come before us.

Mr. Winters asked about the building height ordinance. What does that allow?

Council President Cefolo-Pane stated that the vertical distance of structure measured from the average elevation of the finished grade 10 feet from the building corners to the level of the highest point of the roof. On lots of less than two (2) acres in lot size, where retaining walls are proposed, the height shall be measured from the average grade of the lot prior to construction.

Maureen Mulligan, 9 Kice Road

I have been in before the Council to talk about the increase in ratables relating to all of the construction on Park Avenue. I have some numbers that Sheila's staff provided through OPRA. The samples from just four properties show a great deal of money coming in. There are two properties for Summit Medical Group which shows almost a million dollars for just one of them over two years. The other one is \$600,000 over two years. For Archer Hotel there is also \$200,000 and for BASF it is almost 2 million. It is so much money. I don't understand why the taxes haven't gone down. Mrs. Mulligan stated that since she is showing exact figures she thought it would be easier to look at. She provided a handout to the Borough Clerk to pass along to the Council.

MRs. Mulligan complemented the Borough on the new bridge at Spring Garden Lake; it is a big improvement.

She is the proud parent of a Lou Boyd award and likes the suggestions that were set forth for that.

Council President Cefolo-Pane thanked Mrs. Mulligan for her input.
